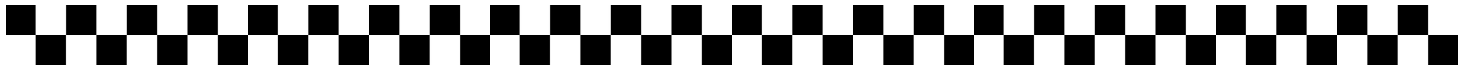

CENTENNIAL DISTRICT PINEWOOD DERBY CHAMPIONSHIP

2019 Rules and Race Procedures

- A. Race Entrant Classification
 - a. Entries that comply with the Cub Scout Class construction rules below and are submitted by Cub Scouts (including former Webelos Scouts who have bridged over to Boy Scouts during the current pack year) will be classified as Cub Scout cars, and will be eligible to win an award.
 - b. Other entries may be accepted at the discretion of the race officials, but will not be eligible for awards.
- B. Registration
 - a. All entrants must register their car before the race begins.
 - b. Cars will be checked for size, weight, clearance, and race legal materials (axles, wheels and body) during the registration process.
 - c. Cars become the responsibility of the race officials once they are registered.
 - i. This responsibility is only meant to imply that race officials will always move your car in a careful manner, and will endeavor to keep unauthorized people from touching or handling the car.
 - ii. Should the car become damaged while in the care of race officials these officials will in no way be held responsible.
 - d. If a car becomes damaged while in the care of race officials:
 - i. If repairs are trivial, they will be attempted by a race official. Non-trivial repairs will not be attempted, and the entry may be removed from the remainder of the race.
 - e. Cars will be returned to the owner after racing has been completed, or on demand if the entrant withdraws from the race.
- C. Sportsmanship
 - a. Good sportsmanship is expected at all times by all persons present at the Centennial District Pinewood Derby.
- D. Judging
 - a. An automated system will be used to determine the winner of each heat, and to calculate the overall winners.
 - b. If the automated system malfunctions or is in any other way unavailable, race officials will implement a manual scorekeeping system for Cub Scout class entries.
 - c. If a race official makes a decision and you wish to appeal it, all assembled race officials will conduct a review. The decision rendered by such an appeal is final.
- E. Car Dimensions, Weight & Clearances (including any fixtures or accessories):
 - a. Maximum width (including wheels): 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ "
 - b. Maximum length: 7"
 - c. Width between wheels: 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ "
 - d. Bottom clearance between car and track: $\frac{3}{8}$ "
 - e. Maximum weight: 5 ounces, as measured on the race committee scale.
- F. Cub Scout Class Car Construction:
 - a. When constructing the car follow the rules that come with the Official Cub Scout Grand Prix Pinewood Derby Kit.
 - b. All standard car components (body, wheels, axles) must be from an Official Cub Scout Grand Prix Pinewood Derby Kit.
 - c. Wheels may be trimmed to remove burrs or injection flanges, but must not be modified in any other way.
- G. Lubrication:
 - a. Only dry graphite may be used as a lubricant for wheels.
- H. Fixtures and Accessories:
 - a. No loose materials, springs, magnets, liquids, propulsion devices or moving parts will be allowed on or in a car.
 - b. Any car having any item or component which in the opinion of the race committee is dangerous, hazardous, in poor taste or presents an image not in keeping with Scouting can be disqualified.
